WORDS FROM THE PASTOR

On this third Sunday of Lent we reflect on the Samaritan woman at the well. The parable of the Good Samaritan reminds us of the animosity between the Jewish people and the Samaritans. The Samaritans had the same roots as the children of Israel, but had adapted the faith to their lives. They did not come to worship at the Temple in Jerusalem, which was considered a requirement for faithful Jews. They worshiped in their own holy places. They had intermarried with people of different tribes so were not considered pure. The two communities shared little in common. Jesus and his disciples were not always welcomed in Samaritan territory. We know of the parable of the Good Samaritan. The priest and the scholar of the law did not stop to minister to the man who had been robbed and beaten by robbers. He was in such bad shape that one could not determine what tribe he might be from. The Jewish officials did not stop to help him as the Sabbath day was coming and touching blood would render them unclean. These "model citizens" did not want to get involved. The Samaritan, by contrast, took pity on the man and ministered to him. He took him to an Inn and paid the proprietor to care for him. He promised to come back and pay any additional amount the innkeeper had incurred.

The encounter of Jesus and his disciples with the Samaritan woman is equally surprising. A Jewish man would not converse with any woman, lest of all a Samaritan woman. After the disciples left, Jesus asks the Samaritan woman for a drink of water. She responds, how could he, a Jew, ask a Samaritan, lest of all a woman for a drink of water. Jesus responds that he can give living water. She asks if he is greater than Jacob (Israel) who had given the people this well. Jesus replies that he would give living water that would bring eternal life. She may not have understood his word, but asks for this living water so she would not have to come to draw water in the heat of the day. The other women came in the morning when it was cool, but she knew that she would not be treated well by these women. Jesus asks her to go and call her husband. She replies that she does not have a husband. Jesus reveals that she has had five husbands, and the one who she was with was not her husband. She acknowledges that this is true and goes to summon the others to come and encounter the Messiah, the Christ. Jesus says that he was the Christ. She goes back to the village and evangelizes them, inviting them to encounter the source of living water. Many come to believe that Jesus is the Christ.
